PE Grant Impact 2022-23

The funding has enabled the school to participate in all available competitions that have been possible including competitions at levels 2 (other local schools) and 3 (representing regional schools).

Able and talented- The funding has developed a widening link with different clubs, allowing specialist coaches to work with the school and talent spot. A number of children have since moved on to join these clubs outside of school time.

Intra-school events (for example Santa Dash, hockey, netball and football inter-house, 4 sports days) and whole school activities have been (and will continue to be) undertaken ensuring 100% participation in different sporting activities (for example whole school experience days - inclusive sports, team building, Olympic Day and dance). This has provided motivation and enjoyment as well as team work across the year groups. It has also had an impact on increased physical activity at break times and lunchtimes.

We have contributed to the provision of resources to improve the experiences of all children in sporting activities . This has also helped the teachers to teach PE and sport more effectively. We have hired swimming coaches for top up lessons in order to successfully increase the number of children able to pass the national curriculum targets.

Active play was significantly developed through additional provision and training. Year 5 play leaders were trained and new equipment provided for free period play. This included construction resources and scooters.

The school continues to hold the afPE and Platinum School Games award.

The school increased the sports provision for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities for example: football coaching and general sports coaching with specialist SEND teachers. SEND specific local competitions 'sport festival', new age curling and boccia.

Additional extra curricular activities were extended across the whole school, reflected in the increased participation figures.

The school introduced a new fitness strand in the curriculum - mini trampolines to increase pupils stamina, proprioception, balance , coordination and fitness levels. 35 staff were trained and it has now been embedded into the curriculum.

How will we spend the grant 2023-2024?

The Quinta Primary School consistently strives to promote healthy and active lifestyles and to provide sporting opportunities for all of its pupils.

- Develop CPD to increase the range of activities offered in the opportunities thread of the PE curriculum.
- Play leaders will again be trained in year 5 to encourage more active break times and lunchtimes.
- Provide a number of specialist training days with Bee Active to every child in the school – targeting areas that will make a significant impact on their attitude to, and involvement in, PE and living a healthy life. Teachers will utilise these as CPD so they can be used in the future.
- Improve the provision for our Early Years - Preschool and Reception.
- Offer a wider variety of after school clubs to encourage higher participation.
- Identify and target children who are not actively involved in physical education and will actively promote the clubs within school to improve the uptake.
- Continue to build up resources and equipment within the school to further improve the children’s sporting activities and break times.
- Enter a wide variety of sports competitions at level 2. We will try to enter A,B, C and D teams wherever possible so more children have the opportunity to represent the school.
- Develop healthy , active break time and lunchtime through staff training and resources.
- Train a new specialist sports crew to set up activities and competitions and provide a pupil voice.
- Provide additional swimming instruction for pupils in the later years of primary still unable to attain the national curriculum expectations.
- Introduce table tennis as an extra opportunity sport.
- Introduce more intra-school competitions.
