Being Vigilant and Stranger Danger

We are aware that there has been some false information circulating about individuals approaching pupils at the school gates in neighbouring towns. We want to assure you that should this information have been true that we would have informed you.

Safeguarding all of our pupils is a priority at The Quinta. We want to assure parents that all members of staff are fully up to date with all legal statutory safeguarding legislation. We also have a designated safeguarding team in school should you have any concerns (however small). These members of staff are:

Children's Safety Walking Home

We would like to clarify our walking home arrangements. Currently, our Y5 and Y6 children can walk home on their own as long as their class teacher (as well as the other staff who teach them) is informed via the Google Form. We know that some parents and guardians have already contacted their class teachers, please fill in the form too so that the office and other teaching/supply staff are aware.

This year, we have had some Y4 parents enquire if their children can walk home too. It is our belief that Y4 children still need dropping off and collecting from school by an adult. However, we equally know that maturity and circumstances differ greatly between each child and this is your decision as parents and guardians to make.

Therefore, in some exceptional circumstances, we will allow Y4 pupils to walk home with the provision that the request is put through to the office and a member of SLT has agreed to it. This is so that we are aware of these specific circumstances.

In deciding whether your child is ready to walk to school you should assess any risks associated with the route and your child's confidence. Work with your children to build up their independence while walking to school through route finding, road safety skills and general awareness.

When deciding whether your child is ready for this responsibility you might want to consider the following:

- 1. Do you trust them to walk straight home?
- 2. Do you trust them to behave sensibly when with a friend?
- 3. Are they road safety aware?
- 4. Would they know what to do if a stranger approaches them?
- 5. Would they have the confidence to refuse to do what a stranger asked?
- 6. Would they know the best action to take if a stranger tried to make them do something they didn't want to do (scream, shout, kick or fight)?
- 7. Would they know what to do if they needed help?
- 8. Would they know who best to approach to get help? If you are not confident about how your child would react then you should seriously consider whether you should allow them to walk on their own.
